

What to do if you have a case of COVID-19 in your school

1 CHILD OR STAFF MEMBER WHO HAS SYMPTOMS of

New continuous cough Temperature

Change in sense of smell or taste

(Refer to PPE guidance on gov.uk if personal care is required within 2m)
If a staff member, they should go home immediately.

IF the CHILD is in the setting – Isolate

away from others until they can be

picked up from school.



Individual goes home to self-isolate for 10 days since onset of symptoms and get tested via NHS online or calling 119.

Household contacts of case self-isolate for 14 days.



No need to notify PHE Health Protection Team.



Cleaning as per guidance on cleaning in nonhealthcare settings on gov.uk if was in setting 48 hours prior to onset of symptoms.

1 CHILD OR STAFF MEMBER WHO TESTS POSITIVE

2 or more children or members of staff in your setting who have **TESTED POSITIVE**, with illness onset dates within 14 days of each other and who are known to have been in the same class or had contact with each other IF the CHILD is in the setting – Isolate away from others until they can be picked up from school.

If a staff member, they should go home immediately.
